SUBJECT: COVID-19 Statutory and Regulatory for Public Housing and Housing Choice Voucher

NOTICE: PIH 2020-05

PURPOSE: Pursuant to the authority provided under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act (Public Law 116-136), HUD is waiving and establishing alternative requirements for numerous statutory and regulatory requirements for Public Housing Program and Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Program. These waivers provide administrative flexibilities and relief to public housing agencies (PHAs). Use of these waivers is at the discretion of the PHA; however, HUD strongly encourages PHAs to utilize any and all waivers and alternative requirements as necessary to keep public housing and HCV programs operational to the extent practicable.

The notice also provides information on additional actions HUD is taking, including the temporary suspension of the Public Housing Assessment System (PHAS) and the Section Eight Management Assessment Program (SEMAP)

Attached is Notice PIH 2020-05 and the waivers that the Housing Authority of the City of Madera will be utilizing to keep our employees and Tenants safe.
